Priority topics are traffic rules, vehicle maintenance, and general knowledge. Prepare with NCERTs and driving

## WHAT TO STUDY FIRST

Begin by thoroughly understanding the selection process, which comprises an OMR Written Examination (40% weightage) and a Driving Test (60% weightage). Prioritize studying General Awareness, Gujarati and English Grammar, and Basic Computer Knowledge as these form the core of the written exam. Simultaneously, familiarize yourself with traffic rules and regulations, vehicle maintenance, and basic driving techniques for the practical test. The NCERT textbooks for Class 10 and 12 can serve as a foundational resource for general subjects.

GSRTC Driver Recruitment 2026: OMR Written Examination & Driving Test

Marking: The final merit list is prepared based on a combined weightage: 40% from the OMR Written Test (100 marks) and 60% from the Automatic Driving Test (50 marks). Each question in the written exam carries 1 mark. There is a negative marking of 0.25 marks for each wrong, blank, or overwritten answer.

Negative: 0.25 marks will be deducted for each wrong answer, blank answer, overwritten answer, or multiple-option response in the OMR Written Examination.

- Selection process includes two stages: OMR Written Examination and Driving Test.
- OMR Written Test carries 40% weightage, and the Driving Test carries 60% weightage.
- A total of 4,599 Driver vacancies are to be filled.
- Online application window: June 6, 2026, to July 5, 2026.
- Medium of examination for the written test is Gujarati for all subjects except English Grammar. [cite: 1 (General pattern for similar exams by GSRTC)]
- Minimum 35 marks are required to pass the Driving Test (out of 50).
